The program will address critical skill gaps in the workforce by providing interns with expert training and education from sector leaders, and will include host organisations from metropolitan and regional Queensland, New South Wales and South Australia.

Hosts will provide a dedicated mentor to facilitate the intern experience for 10 months from January 2023. Hosts will also provide program feedback and be involved with the program impact assessment.
